Join us for our upcoming solo exhibition titled *Simply Home*. The exhibit features oil paintings by local artist Jana Botkin. It will be on view from October 19 through December 29. An opening reception will be held on Saturday, October 19, from 4:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

Jana Botkin is a lifelong resident of Tulare County, the daughter of an Ivanhoe farmer. She has an AA in art from COS along with many years of study and practice in what she terms "The School of Figure It Out." Jana aims to provide visible reminders that Tulare County is a place to be proud of. Her style is tight realism, and her work is recognized by its detail and accuracy. Jana is a full time artist and has published two books of local cabin communities, *The Cabins of Mineral King* and *The Cabins of Wilsonia*, six local coloring books, and *Mineral King Wildflowers: Common Names*. Exeter Fall Festival Museum Tour

CACHE will be participating in the Exeter Fall Festival with a museum tour on Sunday, October 13 from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m.

Tour highlights include a Yokuts exhibit titled *Yokuts: "The People" of the San Joaquin Valley*. The exhibit features a handwoven basket display currently on loan from Wukchumni Indian tribe representative, Jennifer Malone, an authentic Tule Boat, and hands-on activities for kids, including hulling and grinding an acorn, and rock painting. Visitors can also view the current art exhibit, *Illumination*, featuring original watercolor and acrylic paintings by Krista Fulbright, and a new permanent sculpture exhibit by Adrian Green titled *Adrian Green: Work of Art*.

Exeter School System History Talk

Dwight Miller returns with a brand new *CACHE Chats: Tales of Exeter and Beyond* history talk. Next month's topic is "School Bells and Heritage: Exploring Exeter's Educational Past." The discussion will be held on November 18 at 5:30 p.m.

Join us for thought provoking stories of early Exeter area schools. Miller will discuss the first schools in the area that began well before the town of Exeter was formed in 1888; these include Rocky Hill, Locust Grove, Kaweah, Central, Venice Hill, Lindcove, and Lemon Cove. Several major controversies arose in those early years resulting in community outrage that erupted in a major meeting, and petitions were signed. He will also propose that Exeter's Woodrow Wilson School was the first "Wilson School" in the United States.
