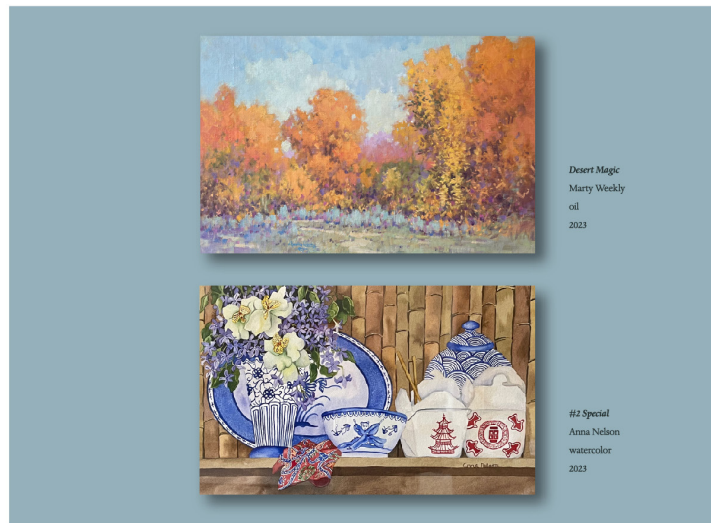

## Upcoming Oil and Watercolor Duo Exhibition at CACHE

CACHE will be hosting a duo exhibition titled *Oil & Water Do Mix*. The exhibit features oil and watercolor paintings by CACHE Art Gallery founders Marty Weekly and Anna Nelson. It will be on view from April 6th through June 30th, 2024. An opening reception will be held on Saturday, April 6th, from 4:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

Marty Weekly was born and raised just west of Exeter, CA, and graduated from Exeter Union High School in 1954. He received his degree in art at Sacramento State College and then embarked on a high school teaching career. In 1970, due to an increased demand for his paintings, he decided to quit teaching and become a full-time artist. During his 50-plus-year career, he exhibited at prestigious galleries throughout the Western United States, including Dallas, TX, Los Angeles, CA, and Santa Fe, NM. Marty is published in "Contemporary Western Artists" by authors Peggy and Herald Samuels and is listed in Davenport's List of Collectible Artists of the 20th

## Tales of Exeter and Beyond

We would like to announce the start of a series of history talks by CACHE's board president, Dwight Miller, entitled *CACHE Chats: Tales of Exeter and Beyond*. Dwight's first discussion is scheduled for Monday, May 20th, at 6 p.m., and the topic is "The Exeter Invincibles," a semi-pro football team in Exeter in 1920 who went undefeated over two seasons and were declared State Champions each season, bringing hope to a worn community.

Prior to 1915, sports contests between high schools were limited and not very organized. In 1914, high school administrators throughout the state formed the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) to establish and govern rules and regulations around athletic competitions between schools in each region. One of the first rules was to make "American Rules" football the standard instead of the previously played rugby games. When football season began in the fall of 1915, Bill Springer (the great-grandfather of David Nielsen of Nielsen & Associates Insurance) was called to coach the boys—he was the only one in town who knew the rules and had any idea how to conduct a practice or design a play. The team went on to win their first six games, scoring over 100 points in two of those wins, creating a lasting buzz in the Exeter community.

Years later, after American entry into the Great War (WW1) and the service of many of these same young men, a semi-pro league of adult football sprang up around the state. Their exploits are a part of Exeter's history, and the men of that era went on to make significant contributions to their communities.
