Miguel Pujol's Solo Exhibition Reception Boasts Highest Turnout

CACHE hosted an artist reception for the solo exhibition *Moments* by Miguel Pujol on Saturday, July 11. The number of people who attended the event was astonishing! Over 200 attendees viewed the collection of paintings celebrating the beauty found in everyday life.

Pujol, originally from Argentina, moved to the United States as a young adult. Here he discovered a new home and a deep appreciation for the people, places, and simple experiences that shape a community. Those experiences became a lasting source of inspiration for his paintings.

Miguel works exclusively in acrylics. Through expressive brushwork, warm light, and simplified forms, he invites viewers to complete the story with their own memories and experiences. Many of the paintings in the exhibition are inspired by life in and around Exeter, celebrating the relationships, traditions, and sense of belonging that make a small town extraordinary.

In addition to the inspiring artwork, the event was catered by Monet's Wine Bistro. Delicious appetizers and

fine wines were enjoyed leisurely throughout the evening. Visitors were encouraged to try their luck at the blind tasting table, where a selection of three different wines was offered and the types were guessed. A Monet's gift card was generously awarded to the winner. Chocolates from Stafford's were the final touch to the indulgent experience.
