Stop by CACHE during our regular business hours to see the wonderfully intricate Hilliard House dollhouse currently on display in our historical exhibition space.

“The Hilliard House was still standing when Visalia resident Howard Hill recreated it through a joint effort between Howard and Gloria Hill and a class of 16 miniature enthusiasts. Because of the difficulty and investment of time involved in building an original miniature house without a kit, Howard worked up a “Visalian” kit containing all the pre-cut pieces needed to assemble the framework of the house.

In the Fall 1982 issue of the *Miniature Gazette*, the National Association of Miniature Enthusiasts (N.A.M.E.), features “The Visalian” on the cover, along with an article on the Hill family business *One of a Kind Wood Shop*.”
