

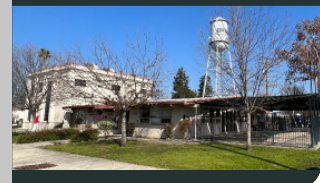

May will bring an exciting events lineup. First and foremost, we are thrilled to announce the grand opening of our museum on June 10th! This has been a long-awaited moment, and we are excited to share the joy with all of you. It will be a place for telling Exeter's stories and for artists to be celebrated. Join us for the ribbon-cutting ceremony and a tour of our newly renovated and rebranded facility.

With the grand opening we will also dedicate two new additions to our museum - the bell and the granite trough at the west of the museum.
