Miller presents latest history talk.

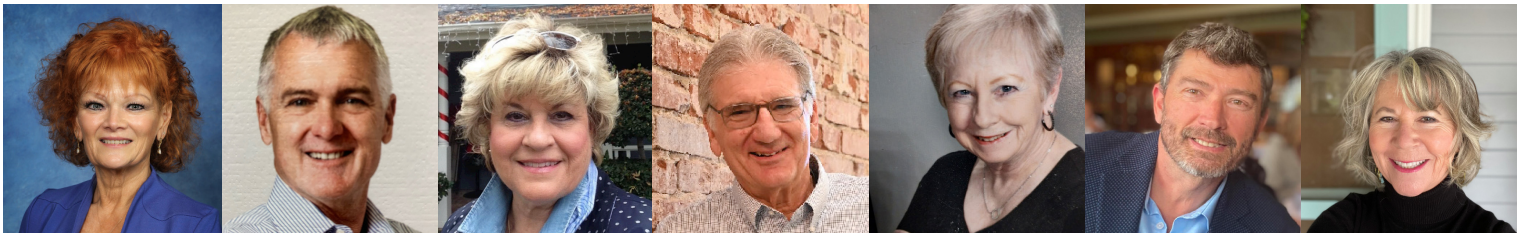
